Musical Director's Message: By Bill Litz

I'd like to welcome you all to the NEW & IMPROVED Stockton Portsmen Mixed Barbershop Harmony Association Chorus! I'm sure you've noticed the theme and focus of issue #2 leaning toward our new identification, embracing our mixed configuration - not apologizing for it.

As we have asked more from ourselves over the past few weeks, I have been amazed at what each of us IS capable of. I've seen: expressive faces; fluid, genuine body movements; and a more relaxed but focused and energized stance. I've heard: dynamics; improved singing quality; better intonation and balance of chords; phrases, not just notes and words. Chorus Craft: By John Eilers

Varying your singing volume when asked by your director is an important skill in Chorus. Volume is rated from 1 to 10 for voice. A typical low volume might be 2 or 3, while a high volume might be 8 or 9.

One must always be careful not to put pressure in your voice when increasing volume. Pressure leads to distorting your sound which can hinder a ringing chord.

Another factor in volume changes is a good support of air. Air support is needed at low volume as well as high volume. Project your voice further out in front of your forehead. Focusing the sound in front of you with air support, you can increase volume without pressure.

I've been singing with the Portsmen for nearly three years. Previous musical experience includes high school and college marching band (trumpet), fraternity song team in college, and 35 years of singing tenor in several church choirs. Among my most enjoyable memories are rolls in two great musicals at Stockton Civic Theater. My first vocal experience occurred at UOP Music Camp in 1955 when as an instrumentalist we were all required to audition for the mandatory Music Camp Choir. Prior to that I mistakenly thought singing was only for people with "good voices."

That summer camp experience taught me that anyone who can carry a tune can quickly learn to read music and enjoy blending their voices with others. This opened the door for me to develop and revere a most rewarding lifetime hobby. Now, 60 years later, I still love every minute I can set aside to nurture my limited vocal talent, and do it with great friends in a safe, congenial environment where good times and encouragement abound. It is truly a blessing.

Among the highlights of these last three years with The Portsmen are: Participating in the heart-rending patriotic Memorial Day services at Lodi's Cherokee Cemetery; singing our National Anthem at Stockton Ports baseball games; performing before enthusiastic audiences at our local barbershop harmony shows; competing with talented quartets and choruses from other N. California chapters; and regularly feeling the rush of emotion as 15 or 20 vigorous voices blend in uniquely close harmony every time we gather for rehearsal under the professional-quality direction and encouragement of our own maestro, Bill Litz.

Since we are a "mixed chorus", we're more inclusive than most BHS Society chapters, and couples have an opportunity to enjoy this hobby together. Of course we are always inviting others to drop in and check us out during Tuesday night rehearsals at 7:00 pm at Stockton's Zion Lutheran Church.


