Musical Director's Message: by Bill Litz

Last week, one of the new *Portsmen* members told me singing with the chorus was helping him find his smile. That is exciting to me for a number of reasons.

First, it makes me know that he is **enjoying connecting with the Portsmen family**. Next, it shows that the style of music we do and the song selections are **creating a positive energy and joy** in his life. Those combine to create the physical feelings that **recharge his batteries** and make him come back week after week.

For me, the real excitement is that **singing with a smile** - that feel-good emotion – is **creating a better sound** in the chorus. I'm seeing (and hearing) that type of singing from more members every week. The next step in the singer's evolution is to develop "the inner smile" - the secret to great resonance. It's really not about showing off your pearly whites and saying cheese. It's about the shape you achieve on of the inside of your mouth when the outside of your face appears to be smiling. The notion of an inside smile is simply another way to describe the lifting of the lower pads of your eyes and the roof of your mouth (the palate) which creates more resonant space inside your mouth.

Arden Kaywin wrote an article that includes a video that speaks to the question "Have you ever noticed that really great singers always seem to be smiling when they sing?". It is a discussion of the singers smile - How Smiling Will Improve Your Singing. Another resource demonstrating ways to lift the palate and keep it up has a clip of **Celine Dion** showing some vocal exercises that may speak to you.

Here are a number of descriptions of how to achieve an inner smile that are worth a try. See which one makes sense to you.

- Doing a gentle yawn
- Flaring the nostrils
- Biting an apple
- Smelling the brownies
- Widening the ears

These visual concepts on how to **create resonant space** that will yield **better singing tone**, feel a bit like a **mechanical formula** to me – like pressing keys on a piano.. Sometimes formulas like "inner smile", or "singer's posture" or "breathing techniques" or "vowel shaping" are what we need to kick start our singing when we feel tired or unmotivated to sing with emotion. But I hope that as you try different techniques of singing, that **the ultimate goal is communication and eliciting emotion**.

As you sing this month, see if you can find an "inner smile". Then go one step further and inject your singing with **heartfelt emotion** that will transform the inner smile to genuine emotion, that in addition to communicating with our audience, carries **joy and a smile** into your daily life.


Tune Struck Quartet


